I hope this letter finds you well and filled with the grace of God. As we continue our journey of faith together, I am writing to you as we near the end of the Easter season to reflect on the importance of engagement and stewardship within our Catholic community.

Attending Mass on Sundays is vital to stewardship and engagement. Stewardship and engagement include actively participating in the life of the Church and nurturing our spiritual growth. It involves volunteering our time and talents, participating in ministries, and building meaningful relationships within our parish family. We already have enough volunteers to bring back coffee and donuts on Sundays! Last week, I started sending emails out to those who have volunteered, connecting you with the ministry chair or liaison. If you don't hear from them this summer, please let me know. We have gotten some great ideas for new ministries. We hear your call to create a quilting club and bring back families with small children. We hope to open the door for these ministries, along with reviving the Women's Club and Grandparents' Club.

Be sure to mark your calendars this fall for our pictorial directory. We are planning to have photographers here September 10th-20th. We hope you will join us in making this directory as complete as possible. Later in the year, we plan to share the My Own Church App from our new database. With the app, you will have access to update your family information in real-time. For those who participate in the directory, this will give us the capability to add your photo to our database and app.

One last note about our stewardship renewal: We ask that you complete a renewal each year so that we know where you want to engage with our community. Maybe you want to try a new ministry or perhaps chair a ministry. This renewal allows us to know where our parishioners' interests are and how we can help them become vital members of the community. Each of you has so many gifts and are so willing to share those gifts! We want to use the gifts of many, not the gifts of few. We thank each of you for sharing your gifts with Holy Trinity.

## St. Matthews PreK, K, and Grades 5-7 End of Year Celebrations

- Arrive at the portico/gathering space entrance and sign in up to 15 minutes before the start of the program. You'll be seated in the Church before students arrive. (Please do not enter through the school office or any church doors.)
- If you plan to have siblings in classes at St. Matthews join you for the program, you must email their homeroom teachers at least 1 day in advance requesting they dismiss your child for the program. Then, upon your arrival at the gathering space and signing in, you'll pick up your other children to join you for the program. After the program ends, you'll drop them back off for class.
