Remembering 9/11

Last week we remembered the 23rd anniversary of 9/11. For most of us, we will all remember exactly where we were when the news and footage of the planes hitting the World Trade Towers were shown on TV. For me, I was teaching Theology at Our Lady of Providence High School. I had students in my room when another teacher informed me about the first plane hitting the tower. I had a study hall following and I, along with some students, watched as the second plane struck the other tower. It was a surreal experience to know

the amount of death and suffering that was taking place in front of me as the cameras caught every detail, including people jumping to their deaths to avoid the fire and suffering inside. I could feel my own anger and outrage build throughout the days, as news came in about the Pentagon and the crashed plane in Pennsylvania.

A lot of people felt that same anger and outrage across our nation. The question that I had was, as a Catholic high school teacher, what to do with the anger that I had, that my students had, and how should we express those hard emotions in a way that was real but also remained within our Catholic belief system.

As we discussed these events in class for the following weeks, I found it difficult to navigate my students away from stereotyping an entire religion or ethnic group. At their young age, it was easier for my students to process their grief and anger by lumping and naming an entire group instead of looking at the actual individuals and militia groups behind these attacks.

As a Catholic teacher, it was important for me to shape the minds and hearts of my students during this time in a way that didn't diminish what occurred, but allowed them to continue to trust and see God in people no matter the color of their skin or religion.

Since 2001, I often reflect on how easy it is for people to stereotype entire cultures and religions when there is a major world event, even when a vast majority of those people had absolutely nothing to do with it. This would include the Ebola outbreak and the Global Pandemic. In my prayers, I often pray that I don't let any experiences or world events prevent me from finding and seeing goodness in each person I meet.

May we all take time this week to pray for the souls of those who lost their lives on 9/11. May we pray for their families and friends who still grieve the loss of such an important person in their lives. We also pray for all first responders, especially those who are suffering physical and mental health challenges as a result of their job. May God heal them, as we remember and thank them for their bravery and sacrifice.

Early Registration for 2025/26 School Year

Our Early Online Registration for the 2025-2026 school year is now open and runs through January 31st. (This is only for new students who will be enrolling. Instructions for re-enrolling current students will be communicated in early January.) To enroll new students online, simply log on to our website (www.ht-school.org) and follow the admissions procedures. For applications submitted by January 31st, priorities for admission to Holy Trinity Catholic School shall be 1) Parishioners with children already enrolled in Holy Trinity; 2) Parishioners with children not yet in school; 3) Non-parishioners, including non-Catholics. After January 31st, applications will be considered on an as-received basis. The status of applications submitted by January 31st will be communicated by mid-February.

Picture Day

Picture Day is Friday, September 27th. Ordering is done online (before and after Picture Day) at <u>inter-state.com/order</u> using order code 86940GB. You can pay online with your electronic check, debit card, credit card, PayPal, Apple Pay, or Google Pay.

Picture Day is a Non-uniform Day. Below is an excerpt from the Parent/Student Handbook regarding Dress for Non-uniform Days and School Picture Day.

"On special occasions, students will be given a Non-uniform Day. On those days, students may ONLY wear:

- Long jeans, resource day sweatpants (joggers and track pants)
- If shorts are worn, they must be their resource day or uniform shorts.
- Shirts must have sleeves. No tank tops/spaghetti straps should be worn.
- Shoes must have closed backs and closed toes. No cleats, boots, crocs, clogs, mules, roller skate shoes, moccasins, slippers, sandals, or flipflops are permitted.
- All items must be neat and clean.
- Clothing must not be torn/ripped, be too revealing, or have inappropriate messages.
- On Picture Day, girls may wear dresses for their pictures. They may not wear spaghetti-strap dresses. The Administration will make the final decision as to the appropriateness of dress items.
