

Halloween Sucker Sales

Student Council will be selling Halloween suckers beginning October 21st at both campuses. All suckers are \$1 each. The money raised helps pay for Derby Fun treats and activities on Thurby. At St. Matthews, students can buy them in the Gathering Space from 7:30 - 7:50 each morning. (Be sure to come early to get in line.) At Clifton, students can buy them during lunch. We will sell until we sell out, which usually happens in just a few days, so remember to shop early! Flavors include Orange, Lemon Lime, Sour Apple, Sour Mandarin, Sour Cherry, and Strawberry.

Picture Day

Picture Day is Friday, October 25th. Ordering is done online (before and after Picture Day) at <u>inter-state.com/order</u> using order code 86940GB. You can pay online with your electronic check, debit card, credit card, PayPal, Apple Pay or Google Pay.

Picture Day is a Non-uniform Day. Below is an excerpt from the Parent/Student Handbook regarding Dress for Non-uniform Days and School Picture Day.

"On special occasions, students will be given a Non-uniform Day. On those days, students may ONLY wear:

- Long jeans, resource day sweatpants (joggers and track pants)
- If shorts are worn, they must be their resource day or uniform shorts.
- Shirts must have sleeves. No tank-tops/spaghetti straps should be worn.
- Shoes must have closed backs and closed toes. No cleats, boots, crocs, clogs, mules, roller skate shoes, moccasins, slippers, sandals or flip flops are permitted.
- All items must be neat and clean.
- Clothing must not be torn/ripped, be too revealing, or have inapporpriate messages.
- On Picture Day, girls may wear dresses for their pictures. They may not wear spaghetti strap dresses. The Administration will make the final decision as to the appropriateness of dress items."

Idle-Free Zone

As Fr. Steven shared with us in his September newsletter article during the Vatican's International Day of Prayer regarding Care for Creation, we are encouraging drivers on our campuses to be idle-free. With October's focus on St. Francis of Assisi and his work to care for creation in mind, we want to remind everyone of our goal to create school parking lots to be idle-free zones. From KAIRE, "To protect the health of students and others on school campuses, idle-free zones reduce exposure to vehicle exhaust by limiting unnecessary idling of all public and private vehicles on school campuses. Drivers are advised to turn off vehicles when parked on school property and not restart vehicles until necessary to depart." We've put up signs at afternoon carpool locations on both campuses to help us remember this goal. Ideally, we'd like families to consider this goal anytime they're on our campuses for athletic activities, school meetings, carpool, Mass, and parish events, as well as anywhere else they find themselves putting their car in park. Obviously, there are exemptions important to our health - - and the reason for waiting to launch this idea during October's cooler weather - - so please know when necessary, we absolutely respect the use of cars' heaters and air conditioners for the safety of vehicle occupants. Thank you for your support and commitment to helping us create a better environment for ourselves and those we care about, too.
