The "OG" Approach

When Holy Trinity Clifton opened its doors to Catholic students with language-based learning differences/dyslexia, we thoroughly researched what methods of instruction would be best for our enrolled population. Without a doubt, the Orton-Gillingham approach was backed by research and findings of successful intervention. We embarked on making this the cornerstone of our program, training staff at a clinical level and requiring ongoing professional development and continuing education hours to hold .

credentials that would make us a leader in the field of reading remediation through Orton-Gillingham.

So what is the "OG" approach, why is it so widely recommended for dyslexic instruction and why does it work?

In the world of education, effective reading instruction is crucial for developing strong literacy skills. Originally designed to help students with dyslexia, this approach has proven effective for learners of all backgrounds.

The Orton-Gillingham method was developed in the 1930s by Dr. Samuel Orton and educator Anna Gillingham. The Orton-Gillingham approach is a systematic, explicit method of teaching reading, writing, and spelling. It emphasizes the connection between sounds (phonemes) and letters (graphemes), providing a foundation for decoding words. It takes into account the significant amount of research about how the brain works. By identifying strengths and areas of concern in students, we can best develop a plan to support their reading acquisition journey.

The Key Principles of the Orton-Gillingham Approach include:

- 1.Structured Literacy: OG follows a specific sequence of instruction, moving from simple to complex concepts. This structure helps build confidence and skills progressively.
- 2. Multisensory Techniques: The approach engages multiple senses—visual, auditory, and kinesthetic. Students may use letter tiles, write in sand, or say sounds aloud, which reinforces learning through various channels.
- 3. Individualized Instruction: OG recognizes that each learner is unique. Lessons are tailored to meet individual needs, allowing students to progress at their own pace. "We progress the students as quick as we can but as slow as we must"
- 4. Direct and Explicit Teaching: Skills and concepts are taught directly and clearly. This explicit instruction helps students understand the 'why' and 'how' behind reading and the rules that go along with "cracking the code" to reading. Explicit instruction is provided in phonology and phonological awareness, sound-symbol correspondence, syllables, morphology, syntax, and semantics.
- 5. Diagnostic and Prescriptive: Teachers assess students to identify their specific challenges. Based on these assessments, instruction is adjusted to target areas where students may struggle.

Reading is a foundational skill that affects academic success and lifelong learning. It impacts all disciplines for which we teach in a traditional academic setting. The research is proven and those of us who implement it have seen firsthand the impact it can have on reading success, confidence building, and overall love for learning.

Holy Trinity Clifton plans to host a session for parents, practitioners, teachers, and anyone else interested in learning more about how the Orton-Gillingham approach is delivered. We received word from a few people that they did not receive the notification about school being closed on Friday. In order to receive emergency notifications, follow the steps listed below:


- When you log on to myHTPS, you will see a drop down at the top right by your name. Select Settings and then click on Notifications.

Eagle Walk - Important Information

IMPORTANT INFORMATION FOR EAGLE WALK - OCTOBER 4

We can't wait to celebrate our Annual Fund Eagle Walk on October 4 at 12:45 p.m.! Please read the following information regarding walk day logistics and school dismissal after the event. Parents and families are welcome to attend and may arrive at 12:30 p.m. Please see below regarding parking.

EAGLE WALK T-SHIRTS

All students will receive a new Holy Trinity t-shirt with our motto: Bloom where you are Planted. On Friday, October 4, all students should wear this t-shirt to school with resource day bottoms.

COLOR SPRAY

The Eagle Walk will have various color stations where students will be sprayed with bright color powder. The powder is made of cornstarch, baking soda, and food safe dyes; it is non-toxic and free of heavy metals. Students who do not wish to be sprayed should stay further away from the color stations during the walk and cross their arms across their chests to signify that they do not want to be sprayed. At the end of the walk, students may choose to have the color blown off by a volunteer using a leaf blower. The color washes off clothes, skin, and hair. If you are concerned about color transfer, you may wish to pack a towel in your child's backpack or in your car that day.

SCHOOL DISMISSAL

Because the walk is in the afternoon and students may be sprayed with color, students will remain outside and not re-enter the building at the end of the day. When students come outside for the walk, they will leave their backpacks and any other items outside in designated areas along the building (a volunteer will keep an eye on them during the event). Teachers will be outside with their homerooms to sign out any student whose parent attends the walk and wishes to leave from the walk and take the student home. Any student who leaves the school property before 2:40 p.m. must be signed out by a parent with the student's homeroom teacher!

Eagle Walk - Important Information

At 2:40 p.m., dismissal will occur in a slightly different pattern than normal and will occur in the following order:


- Walkers will be dismissed first at 2:40 p.m. Parents, if your child walks home, he or she may be home a few minutes earlier than normal.
- Bus riders will make their way to the busses parked in their normal spots in front of the AFR, but busses may depart school grounds a few minutes later than usual.
- Carpool students will remain in front of the portico while cars are loaded into the parking lot. For any driver who will be picking up students at carpool, please proceed down Leland Road only. We expect all carpool vehicles to line up on Leland and await entry into the school parking lot once it is safe to do so.

WALK PARKING

If you plan to attend the Eagle Walk with your child, please park on one of the following streets:

- Brookfield Avenue
- Elmwood Avenue
- Gilman Avenue

Please park on one side of the street ONLY to allow for neighborhood traffic to pass on the other side. Please DO NOT PARK on Cherrywood Road or Leland Road (these routes are needed for busses and carpool traffic), or in the Maryhill subdivision, as the walk route goes through the neighborhood
