A group of Kindergarten parents recently read The Anxious Generation by Jonathan Haidt. The book provides research and examples supporting the benefits of delaying smartphones for children. The group has committed to signing the <u>Wait Until 8th Pledge</u> to delay giving our kids smartphones due to the harmful effects of social media and internet access for young children.

This is an important thing to talk about and share because when parents band together the pressure felt by both the kids and parents decreases. Holy Trinity has such a strong community that draws many families together. Community support is needed to ensure our children are protected from the negative impact social media has on them.

Good Luck to our grades 6 - 8 KYA student delegates who will be representing their views at their middle school conference this week with around 1,000 peers from across the state! Our bills include:

- Allowing "Granny Cams" at assisted living facilities in Kentucky if installed by interested families to prevent elder abuse
- Allowing speech therapy services to continue if needed because of a physical difference/disability (Ex: speech impediment) and not have it based on one's ELA grade (discontinued if you have an A)
- Requiring monthly intruder drills at schools, increased from the 1 per year currently required, to align with the monthly fire drill requirement

We're excited to have our first elected presiding officer in Holy Trinity history, 8th grader Bob English serving as Lt. Governor. We'll be cheering on and campaigning for next year's presiding officer candidate, 7th grader Ellie Smith. Good Luck, Eagles!
