#### **December Friendzy Unit - Bounce Back**

Through December we have been in our fourth Friendzy Unit: BOUNCE BACK. This unit teaches us to understand the important concept of resilience and to develop skills that will help us bounce back from the challenges we face.

Catchphrase (main point for students to catch on to): "Bounce Back"

Key Verse (Biblical anchor points):

- Philippians 1:6: "Being confident of this, that he who began a good work in you will carry it on to completion until the day of Christ Jesus."
- Isaiah 40:30-31a: "Even youths grow tired and weary, and young men stumble and fall; but those who hope in the Lord will renew their strength."

What does it mean to be resilient? Resilience is a person's ability to bounce back in response to hard or challenging times. It is working through things that are hard and not giving up. The dictionary defines resiliency as "the capacity to recover quickly from difficulties; toughness."

Continue the Conversation at home with your student. Here are the Four R's of Resilience, a strategy to use when we are faced with a challenge so that we can BOUNCE BACK.

- 1. Take time to recognize hardships. It's important to say "This is hard!" Then we can begin to find ways to bounce back. When we bounce back after a challenge, we get stronger and are better prepared for the next challenge.
- 2. Remain hopeful when facing challenges. Every person in the world has hardships. When we place our hope in God, He renews our strength and gives us the ability to bounce back (Isaiah 40:30-31a).

- 1. Reframe how you view hardships. Choose to focus on what you have, rather than what you've lost. Look for opportunities in the midst of opposition. Tell your story from a lens of hope.
- 2. Have supportive relationships. Other people help us bounce back. Sometimes we don't notice the people in our lives who care for us and cheer us on. It's important to remember who these people are.

A sense of belonging is one of the most powerful predictors researchers have discovered that determines how strong a person's resiliency is. The more parents, siblings, and families can help students feel like they truly "belong," the more likely they will be to BOUNCE BACK when faced with challenges or difficulties.

We encourage your families to discuss bouncing back, and the idea of resilience at home; being open with your child about your level of resiliency and ability to bounce back from different situations you have faced. We want to hear from you and celebrate the growth and success of our students. Linking arms in partnership with you—we are in this together!

## Waterstep Shoe Drive

Cleaning out your closets and storage areas this holiday break or as a part of your New Year's Resolutions? KUNA and our Presiding Officer Candidate, Brinn S, would love to have your shoe donations! Partnering with Waterstep, our KUNA delegation will be collecting new or gently used shoes from January 1 - 15 at both campuses. Waterstep sells shoes around the world to fund clean-water initiatives in times of emergency, such as the hurricane that impacted water in North Carolina recently, in remote villages globally, and in areas where clean water is not readily available. Did you know that often children are responsible for retrieving the water needed daily for their family, and in doing so, walk miles a day each way, which then prevents them from getting an education? WaterStep is working to change that and make water readily available to all children and families globally.

Please bring in your new or gently used shoes to the collection bins at either campus from January 1 - 15. Shoes cannot be moldy, damaged, or wet. They should always be sent as pairs, and if you can rubber band them together or tie their shoelaces together, that is extremely helpful in requiring less sorting time by Waterstep's volunteers. All donations are greatly appreciated. Thanks for your support in our work to bring clean water to children everywhere.

8th will take MAP Growth Reading, Language Usage, and MAP Growth Algebra I.
