As stated in many communication pieces, Holy Trinity Church supports nearly 100 students with tuition assistance. The total support this year comes in at \$140,000. The reason I wanted to include this tweet in this article was to show the difference between what I believe is right about sports and what I am concerned with about sports. My kids have been involved in playing for high school state titles in Indiana and Molly's current plan is to play Division I soccer next year at Colgate University. I mention that to say, we take sports and being competitive very seriously in our household.

In saying that, I don't think I have ever been prouder of her than on Friday when she stopped playing, stopped competing, and gave genuine care and support to an opposing player. She saw the bigger picture of sports, she learned the lessons that sports are supposed to teach us, and she applied it in the heat of the moment. Truly was a proud Dad moment.

My wish is that all parents will see the bigger picture when attending their children's sporting events and understand that it is how we treat each other (referees, coaches, opposing fans, players) during the intensity of a game that will define who we are. Please know that our children are watching and will mimic what we do as parents. We cannot expect them to be good sports and have sportsmanship if we do not have those same expectations in the stands. I hope our children have good examples to follow and they know how to apply the lessons that sports are supposed to teach us. That way, in the future, when the sports writer says, "Don't often see that.", he would be wrong.


