Dear Holy Trinity Community:

At the most recent Eagle Soiree "Night at the Palm Royale" Event, I had the pleasure of speaking to several families as we enjoyed a night of FUNdraising for Holy Trinity. Many of the conversations lead to questions about the status of the playground on the Clifton campus. I appreciated the opportunity to speak with them directly but also realized that I needed to share this information with the entire community!

As I reflected on my message to you, I kept thinking about our most recent Clifton "family meeting" (all school assembly). Students in Grade 6 introduced us to the value for the month of February. They described that patience helps us to endure hardships and challenges us to have a calm and steady spirit, trusting in God's timing and plan for our lives. It is not a blind trust, but one based on faith and love. The playground journey has been one where I have had to exercise patience and trust that God has a plan.

In 2022, there were two houses located on the property. After purchasing the first house for \$105,000, we began the arduous process of getting permission from the historical society to raze the home. This took about one year but with the help of Potter and Associates Architectural firm, a geotechnical evaluation and several planning & design meetings, we were granted permission. The cost for that was about \$9000. The demolition of the home was \$10,000. While it was costly, we knew that expanding the landscape of the property would allow for a larger playground area. We also removed and disposed of two trees on the property, totaling \$20,400. Much to our surprise,the second home was deemed to be unstable and ordered to be demolished. We were offered the vacant lot for the purchase price of \$110,000. Father Shayne jumped at the chance to have that property as well. The expenses were taken from our Holy Trinity Parish savings account. What you see now is a large area that will be the home of an amazing all accessible playground for Holy Trinity and neighborhood children and their families to enjoy for years to come.

In 2022-2023, fundraising money from the VIP FUNdraiser event was allocated to the playground. To date, we have \$60,000 in the playground account. So what has been happening since 2023 regarding the playground? Father Shayne, Bruce Hines and I have been working with the Dream Foundation to write grants to Kosair Charities and Crusade for Children. We will defend the Crusade for Children grant to the committee in March. Father Shayne has worked tirelessly to procure donations from families and foundations that can support the playground. His next step is to obtain official permission from Archbishop Fabre and to receive his blessing to proceed with this project.

The total cost of the project, not including the work to prepare the ground and deal with slope and grade of the property, is \$599,500. This includes a Bluegrass Recreational Special Assistance Grant for \$64,612.00. All in, we are estimating that this could be an \$800,000 project. The Dream Foundation has had great success in raising funds to build 17 all accessible playgrounds throughout our city and surrounding areas. It has been a joy working with them.

The past 7 years that Holy Trinity Clifton has been open have been nothing but remarkable to witness. We have grown from 13 to 83 students and 8 staff members to 25. The first two years, we occupied just the second floor of the building and now we occupy all three floors as well as the alcove area of the reception hall which recently became our new school library. I share the enthusiasm of the families and students in the desire for a playground for our school. I also know how important it is to do it the right way and to make sure that we create a space that will stand the test of time for future children in our Holy Trinity community.

Please know that we are working as diligently and effectively as we can to make the playground a reality. No grant is too small, no donation is insignificant and in kind gifts get us closer to our goal. Should you wish to support our fundraising and grant writing efforts, please contact me.

Rice Bowls

Tomorrow at Mass, we'll bless our Rice Bowls and be reminded of our call as Catholics to assist Catholic Relief Services (CRS), the official international Catholic relief and development agency of the United States Catholic Conference of Bishops (USCCB), through this annual Lenten drive. Students will then put the bowls together in religion class before Ash Wednesday and bring them home to use throughout Lent. The Rice Bowl comes with a Lenten calendar to assist families in conversations, reflections, and prayers regarding the work CRS does globally and locally, as well as an invitation to donate in whatever way your family can.

From CRS: "CRS Rice Bowl is celebrating 50 years of helping Catholic faith communities bring Lent to life and encounter God through our global family. During the 40 days of Lent, let us journey together through CRS Rice Bowl to meet people in Nigeria, Guatemala, and Bangladesh who are rising above the challenges of hunger and malnutrition. Important Carpool Reminders

Dear Parents,

As the weather turns slightly warmer, I wanted to remind all of our parents and other caregivers about the procedure for Afternoon Dismissal.

Carpool - First Round

If you are arriving early and plan to be in the first round of carpool, please pull forward as far as you can in your row. If there is space available in our middle lanes, please do not block entry into our main parking lot by trying to squeeze into lanes 1 or 2. We ask that all of our parents who have children in Grades 1-8 please stay with your car. Parents and caregivers with children in Grades 1-8 can stand outside of your car, but we ask that you not gather under the Portico. It makes it difficult for us to dismiss our younger grades if we have too many parents gathered by these doors. Parents and caregivers with children in Grades Pre-K and K can come up to the Portico Doors/Covered Sidewalk and meet their child. We ask that once you have your child, you immediately head back to your car so that we can begin dismissing cars in a timely fashion.

Carpool - Second Round

If you are arriving later and are in our second round of carpool, please do not attempt to come to the dismissal area to pick up your child during the first carpool. Parents and caregivers need to stay in their cars and wait until the second carpool before picking up their children. There is a green sign that indicates whether or not you are in the first or second carpool. We ask all parents to follow this procedure. All Pre-K or K parents who park and pick up their child during the second carpool must wait for a teacher to dismiss them before going to their car. No children should be in the parking lot while cars are in motion, regardless if they are with a parent or caregiver.

Walkers

If you are arriving to pick up your child as a walker, we ask that parents and caregivers arrive no sooner than 2:55. In order to provide safety for our students who are walking, we wait until after our second round of carpool to dismiss walkers. Please do not take students off campus during either the first or second round of carpool. All walkers should wait until after the second carpool to begin their walk home.

Other

No parent should park outside of our normal carpool area to pick up students. This includes parking on the street (Brookfield, Elmwood, etc.) or in the Bus Parking Lot. All students who are being picked up at school by a parent or caregiver must be picked up through the normal carpool procedure.

We thank you in advance for following these procedures. We also ask that you share these procedures with anyone who will be picking up your children this school year.

Uniforms with New Logo

In speaking with parents and getting their feedback after the tuition letter went out in January, we have decided to push back the requirement that students wear uniforms with the new Holy Trinity logo starting in the 26/27 school year. We will wait a couple more years to put this requirement into effect. (This will not include new students to Holy Trinity. New students will be required to wear uniforms with the new logo beginning in the 26/27 school year.)

Group Yearbook Photos

Due to last week's snow day, we had to reschedule the group yearbook picture day. The new date for the photos will be this week, immediately following Mass on February 26th. We will start with the younger groups and work our way up, as previously planned.
