This past week, I observed our Pre-K students attend their weekly Catechist of the Good Shepherd class, or as we call it, Atrium. For those unfamiliar with the program, The Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program is designed to teach all aspects of our Catholic faith to our young students by providing a nurturing and spiritually rich environment where faith can take root and grow. This program, rooted in the Montessori method, emphasizes the importance of a child's spiritual development and allows them to develop a deeper understanding of their faith.

Several things stuck out to me as I observed the students in the Atrium.

First, one of the most striking benefits of the Catechesis of the Good Shepherd program is its ability to meet children where they are developmentally. The program uses handson materials that allow children to engage with the Scripture and all aspects of the Mass in ways that make sense to them. This approach makes the teachings of the Church more accessible, fostering a genuine love for God and their faith.

Second, the environment of the Atrium provides an atmosphere that encourages children to focus on their interests and how they are currently experiencing God in their lives. Through the use of scripture, prayer, and hands-on activities, children come to understand that God is a constant part of their lives. Students truly get to know their Catholic faith and the names and meanings of many of the things that they encounter in Mass on a weekly basis.

One of the most moving experiences that I witnessed was how eager the students were to engage in their independent work following the core lesson. Students were engaged with setting the altar, dressing the priest, and setting up their own prayer table. It brought me great joy to watch them talk about their faith and what Jesus meant to them.

I want to thank Chris Allison, Pat Terry, our Pre-K assistants, and Pre-K teachers for all the work they put into making this a possibility for our students. It truly will have a lifelong impact on how they see themselves, their relationship to, and their understanding of their faith.

Our plan is to extend this program next year to include our Pre-K and Kindergarten students. Please pray for the success of the program. Pray for those students who are engaged with the program, along with those adults offering the program.
