Dear Holy Trinity Community,

It is hard to believe, but tomorrow is Ash Wednesday! Time keeps flying by. We now prepare our hearts and minds to enter into this season of penitence and we focus ourselves on the disciplines of prayer, fasting, and almsgiving. Last week at our all-school Mass I asked our pre-K to 8th grade students what would be some good and holy things to do this Lent. Of course, each class/age group had varied answers. Here are some of the things they suggested:

- -Pray every morning before getting out of bed.
- -Pray in the car before coming to school.
- -Pray before every meal.
- -Pray before going to bed.
- -Pray for those who are sick or having problems.
- -Pray for a specific friend or member of the family.
- -Go to Mass every weekend.
- -Pray a Rosary.
- -Pray the Stations of the Cross.
- -Go to Confession.
- -Give to the poor.
- -Volunteer at school or church.
- -Give away toys you don't use anymore.
- -Don't waste food or drink.
- -Clean up after yourself, especially in the school cafeteria.
- -Fill up and turn in your rice bowl.
- -Give up social media.
- -Don't use TikTok
- -Limit your time on electronic devices.
- -Give up junk food.

Again, these are some not all, and we all know there are more and other ways to pray, fast, and give alms this Lenten season. I also want to remind you of an email we sent last year. I would like to encourage you to teach your children about the importance of abstaining from meat on Fridays while packing their lunches for school. I know things can be hectic when getting lunches ready for the school day and sometimes we just forget. Perhaps even as adults we need that gentle reminder too. It is true that those who are Catholic and 14 years of age and older are asked to abstain from meat on Fridays during Lent. However, this practice requires discipline. It's never too early to instill that in our children's lives. I know that most of your children in our school are not yet 14, but it is most helpful to begin that discipline while they are younger, so when they turn 14 it becomes a familiar sacrifice for them and all of us. Thank you for your help.

Lent is a perfect time for us to refocus on what truly matters and that is our relationship with Christ, with the Church, and with one another. We will be offering many opportunities this Lent and I hope you will take advantage of them. We will offer Evening Prayer every Tuesday evening within Mass at 5:00 PM, followed by Adoration until 9:30 PM every Tuesday, and Stations of the Cross every Friday from 5:00 PM-5:30 PM with our fun Fish Fry immediately following. Confessions will be heard every Wednesday during Lent from 12:00 PM-1:00 PM, as well as, every Saturday from 3:30 PM-4:30 PM. We also have small faith-sharing groups you can sign up for. Reach out to Jacqui Rapp in the parish office to sign up!

Let's make this one of the most enjoyable and profound Lenten seasons we have ever had! Know of my prayers for you and please pray for me!
