On Easter Monday, we learned of Pope Francis's passing. When Pope Francis was chosen, I was teaching third grade here at HT. Many classrooms tuned in for the decision, and I recall students wanting to stay to watch for the possibility of smoke instead of going to carpool.

As the passing of Pope Francis is a solemn moment for the Catholic Church, we will take time to grieve before Cardinals begin the sacred process to choose his successor. During this time, called the "sede vacante"

(Latin for "the seat being vacant"), the focus shifts to prayer, reflection, and preparing for the next step - the election of a new pope.

Here at HT, you will notice black curtains hanging on our exterior doors as you enter the Gathering Space and Church. We have covered photos of Pope Francis in our hallways and classrooms with black cloth or taken the photos down. Our prayers call for granting eternal rest upon Pope Francis. Our outside flag is at half-mast. Some classes have watched the live-stream of the Pope lying in state at the Vatican. We're reminded that the pope is not just a religious leader—he's the successor of St. Peter, the Apostle chosen by Jesus to lead His Church. His death reminds us of the continuity of the Church and its guidance through the Holy Spirit.

Over the next two to three weeks, the Cardinals under the age of 80 will gather in Rome for the conclave. Meaning "with key" in Latin, conclave involves the Cardinals being locked in the Sistine Chapel until they make their decision. To be elected, a cardinal must receive at least two-thirds of the votes. This week at Mass, Father Shayne shared with students and teachers the basic requirements to be elected - male, baptized, and not married. Who among our students may grow to be pope someday? After each round of voting, the ballots are burned. If no one is elected, chemicals are added to make the smoke black. When the cardinals finally agree on a new pope, the smoke turns white and a cardinal will step onto the balcony of St. Peter's Basilica to announce: *"Habemus Papam!"*, which means, *"We have a pope!"*

As Catholic families, we are invited to participate in this sacred time through prayer and unity. Here are some things families can do together:

- Pray for the soul of the departed pope and thank God for his leadership.
- Learn about the history of the papacy and the role of the pope in the Church. Here are <u>resources</u> compiled by our Director of Faith Formation, Chris Allison.
- Follow the conclave with reverence, watching for the white smoke and joining in the joy of the announcement. Here's a <u>video</u> Fr. Shayne shared with our teachers explaining the process.
- Pray for the cardinals who must discern God's will in choosing the new pope.
- Welcome the new Holy Father with love and support as he begins his ministry.
